<u>Filip de Boeck</u> is Professor in Anthropology, Institute for Anthropological Research in Africa, KU Leuven.

## **Panel members**

<u>Nnamdi Elleh</u> is Professor and Head of School for Architecture and Planning at University of Witwatersrand, Johannesburg. His interests lie in the connections between architecture, politics and

history on the African continent and he has written multiple publications about the history of planning and development. In 2017, he published 'Architecture and politics in Nigeria: the study of a late twentieth-century Enlightenment-inspired modernism at Abuja, 1900-2016'.

OluTimehin Adegbeye is a writer, speaker, and advocate whose work focuses on human rights, inclusion and justice in the areas of Gender, Sexualities, and Urbanisation. She has worked with e.g. UN Women, the African Women's Development Fund (AWDF) and The Initiative for Equal Rights. OluTimehin's TED Talk "Who Belongs in a City?", was chosen by TED as one of the best ten talks of 2017. She is a current Women Deliver Young Leader and is a leading voice in the Nigerian Young Feminist movement.

**Ronald Wall** specializes in regional and urban economic development and urban planning. He holds the "Chair of Economic Development of the City of Johannesburg and Province of Gauteng" - at the School of Economics and Business Sciences, Faculty of Commerce Law and Management, University of the Witwatersrand, Johannesburg. Ronald is the lead researcher and author of the UN-Habitat report <u>State of African Cities 2018: the geography of African investment</u>, which explores the changing position of African cities within global networks of Foreign Direct Investment (FDI). The report was financed by the African Development Bank (AfDB), UK's Department for International Development (DFID), and the Swedish Foreign Ministry.
